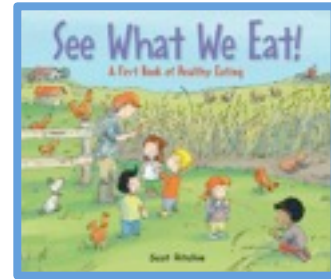


Ag Literacy Program 2018



How Does the Ag Literacy Program Work?

This is the 8th year for Maryland Agricultural Education Foundation's annual **Ag Literacy Program**. This **Ag in the Classroom** program seeks to instill in Maryland students the importance of agriculture in their daily lives. This year's selected book is **See What We Eat** by Scot Ritchie.

Literacy Volunteers set up a time to visit in a nearby school and read to students in grades K-3. Following the reading of the book, volunteers conduct an activity with the students and share their experiences in agriculture. The book is then left in the classroom or media center with a book plate indicating the donor.

See What You Eat story line follows a group of children touring a local farm as they learn where their food comes from. Lesson plans teach about the basic food groups and the importance of eating a variety of healthy foods.
