Learn about turkey farming and make your own turkey decoration using bubble wrap.

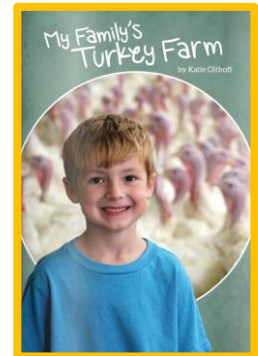

Materials:

- turkey template and card stock for printing
- crayons or colored pencils
- bubble wrap (The inside of a padded envelope works well.)
- scissors, tape or glue
- paint and sponge pieces to use with different paint colors

Instructions:



	<p>1. Color and cut out the turkey body. If you like, you can leave the body white like farm turkeys.</p>		<p>2. Dip sponge pieces into paint and make patterns on the bubble wrap.</p>
	<p>3. With the feather pattern facing up, press the paper onto the painted bubble wrap.</p>		<p>4. Let the paint on the feather paper dry.</p>
	<p>5. Cut out the feathers. Flip them over to see the patterns you made.</p>		<p>6. Glue or tape the feathers to the back of the turkey body. It's turkey time!</p>
